



Care Coordination and Navigation

- Expression of personalized goals, needs, and preferences matched against personalized treatment options
- Adjusted for certain variables that may impact appropriate treatment selection.
- Develop a goal concordant care plan that includes identifying social support and care navigation needs
- Data collection and sharing to track adherence and progress
- Patient Reporting on QoL, functional status, health status and safety
- Care coordination and navigation especially for high cost and high needs patients

Survey Methodology


- Survey open between May 2, 2018 and May 25, 2018
- Eligibility was dependent on receiving a service from PAF during the 2017 calendar year.
- Respondents representative of PAF patient population.
- Response rate of 14% and total of 1,371.
- Presented data is from 568 patients with any cancer diagnosis and 269 diagnosed with HIV/AIDS.
- 70% of HIV/AIDS patients diagnosed more than 10 years ago compared to 10% of cancer patients.
- 53% of cancer patients diagnosed within the last two years compared to 5% of HIV/AIDS patients.

Prevalence & Severity

In the past year, have you experienced a financial hardship due to the cost of your medical care?

- Cancer 70%
- 58% HIV

Sources of Hardship


Percentage of respondents who experienced financial hardship that identified the following as a specific healthcare cost related to treatment that contributed the most to their hardship:

	Cancer (n=365)	HIV/AIDS (n=139)
Office visits to specialists	44%	40%
Radiology services	40%	9%
Oral medication	38%	73%
Lab testing services	36%	24%
Loss of income (work)	34%	8%
Transportation/travel costs	29%	8%
Infused medications	29%	6%
Visits to primary care team	24%	24%

What type of treatments or services have you had in the past 12 months?

Diagnosis	22%	7%
Waiting/watching if treatment is needed	9%	3%
Alternative or complementary therapy	9%	4%
Other	9%	11%




If you experienced a financial hardship, then what impact did it have on your medical care in the last 12 months?

On the Edge of a Cliff

Tucker Seeley's Research Lab at USC identified measures to help capture issues with making ends meet


- 38% said it was very difficult and 30% said it was difficult to live on their total household income right now.
- 13% said they pretty much and 17% said a great deal that they anticipate experiencing actual hardships such as inadequate housing, food or medical attention in the next two months.
- 18% said they pretty much and 18% said a great deal that they anticipate having to reduce their standard of living to the bare necessities of life in the next two months.

Material Hardships

- 33% said there was a time when they were not able to pay the rent or mortgage on time in the last 6 months.
- 15% said they had to go without health care at some point in the last 6 months because they didn't have a way to get there.
- 22% said they had received during the past 6 months a letter from a utility (gas/electric/oil) company threatening to shut off service to the house for not paying bills.
- 43% said that they often or sometimes worried during the past 6 months whether their food would run out before they got money to buy more.

Work Disruptions

Percentage of respondents reporting a work disruption for themselves or spouse during the last year:

	Cancer	HIV/AIDS
Experienced negative work changes	24%	17%
Laid off or dismissed	16%	8%
Changed jobs for a worse one	8%	6%
Other involuntary loss of work	27%	17%






Financial Impact on Care

Have you had to do any of the following in the past 12 months?

- Dip into savings to pay for a medical visit, test or procedure
- Made the decision to pay medical bills instead of other montly expenses
- Had to consider cost of transportation related to medical care
- Tried to find a lower cost option for a medical test or procedure
- Had to consider the financial costs of taking time off work for medical care
- Skip or delay a needed medical procedure due to costs
- Skip a dose of prescription medication or stop taking it





Did any of your doctors (or health care providers) explain that there were choices in what you could do to treat your condition?




Did any of your doctors (or health care providers) explain the costs associated with the treatment options you discussed?




Determining Cost of Care


Where did you attempt to obtain the information you needed about costs of your treatment?



In what areas do you feel that you needed more information about the costs associated with your care?






Cost of Care Conversations: Normative Preferences










To what extent do you agree with the following statement:


How important is it for you to discuss with your medical provider the cost you have to pay for your medical care?


When asked about how helpful specific financial information would be to choosing between treatment options:

Knowing the specific dollar estimates for my out of pocket costs based on my insurance benefits including deductibles, copayments, and		
coinsurance	58%	68%
Knowing the "list price" or "average price" of the drugs involved in your treatment based on the prices used to sell the medication to insurance companies, pharmacies, and physicians (not your out of pocket cost) Knowing about potential costs related to things not covered by	45%	50%
traditional insurance like transportation, lodging, missed work, and child care	43%	39%
Knowing the average amount paid for the treatment by patients with my diagnosis based on studies of the treatment's out of pocket costs using data from thousands of patients	40%	43%
Having a point system for a specific treatment with 1 being least affordable and 5 being most affordable based on the experience of medical professionals	34%	40%




The What and the Who?

Cost Conversations

Indicate the level of importance each of the following statements has to you when having conversations with your medical provider about the costs of your medical care that you would have to pay:

The top choices rated as being very important:

	Cancer	HIV/AIDS
Knowing that there may be resources or options for reducing costs	80%	79%
Knowing the questions you need to ask	73%	69%
Feeling confident that the provider will still provide you with the best care if you ask about costs	72%	72%
Having access to information about the costs associated with the care you need	68%	67%
