



ONS Honors ACCC Executive Director Mortenson

he Oncology Nursing Society (ONS) honored Lee E. Mortenson, D.P.A., ACCC executive director, with the ONS Honorary Member Award on April 18 at the ONS 27th Annual Congress in Washington, D.C. The award was given in recognition of his significant and outstanding contributions to oncology nursing demonstrated by his long-time support of ONS at the national level. His professional values mirror the ONS organizational values. The award of Honorary

Member was established by the ONS in 1988 and only 24 individuals have received this honor.

In presenting the award to Mortenson, Pearl Moore, R.N., M.N., F.A.A.N., ONS chief executive officer, said honorary membership in ONS "is no easy feat," for it takes a special person with outstanding contributions and long-time dedication to ONS at the national level. "No one deserves this honor more" than Lee Mortenson, Moore said.

"I am deeply honored...and will treasure this," said Mortenson on accepting the ONS award. "ONS has served as a

role model and friend. A strong partnership between ONS and ACCC has developed over the past 25 years." He also noted that ONS members have "a positive attitude and enduring willingness to do," pointing out that patients with cancer need to receive quality care in a variety of health care settings, such as by the bedside, in the outpatient setting, and in clinical trials, to name a few.

Open to all cancer care professionals, these free regional meetings are designed to provide attendees with the latest regulatory and legislative updates that apply to cancer delivery. They help cancer program administrators understand the ambulatory payment classification (APC) billing process and assist physician offices with billing and coding questions. Attendees at this spring's symposia learned the latest

details about HIPAA compliance and the challenges of drug reimbursement.

Over the past 11 years, ACCC has hosted more than 120 Regional Oncology Symposia in conjunction with state medical oncology societies. These meetings have now become a tradition and are highly attended by state medical oncology societies, which use them as a core for annual society meeting activities.
