



Physician Recruitment Tips

- Ensure the practice is "ready to recruit."
- Remove barriers to recruitment.
- Screen for fit prior to on-site interview.
- Engage spouse and/or partner early in process.
- Prepare the team to deliver a red-carpet experience.
- Debrief the candidate and interview team immediately.
- Deliver an offer within 48 hours.

Patients Surveyed on Healthcare Costs, **Coverage & Policy**

- 3/4 of Americans say that our country doesn't get good value for what we spend on healthcare.
- 40% say they skipped a recommended medical test or treatment in the last 12 months due to cost; 32% were unable to fill a prescription or took less of it because of its cost.
- 4 in 10 say they fear the costs associated with a serious illness-more than the number who say they fear the illness itself.
- More than half of Americans say they received a medical bill they thought was covered by insurance or where the amount they owed was higher than expected; more than 1/4 say they had a medical bill turned over to a collection agency in the past 12 months.
- About half of Americans disapprove of the way their representative in Congress is handling the cost of healthcare.

Oncologists See Opportunities & Challenges with Emergence of Precision Medicine

- More than 1/3 of survey respondents say precision medicine will have a significant impact on oncology care within 2 to 3 years, while 57% say they believe it will have moderate impact.
- Oncologists see several barriers to adoption, including the cost of drugs (51%), cost of genomic testing (25%), and lack of decision support tools (14%). Also,



76% say more financial aid and reimbursement support is needed for patients.

- About 2/3 of participating oncologists said they use genomic testing to identify the best treatment options for cancer patients, with another 25% saying they are likely to begin using it in the year ahead.
- Availability of genomic testing and turnaround times for results vary greatly. 58% report that testing is not available at their local institution, and 36% say they wait 15 days or longer for results.
- Nearly 6 in 10 participating oncologists cited challenges in interpreting results of genomic tests.
