Equity and Access Committee

Roles & Responsibilities

To support the 3, 2, 1, Go! project, an Equity and Access Committee will be formed. As a member of the Committee, you—along with other stakeholders from the Hawaii Society of Clinical Oncology (HSCO) and patient advocacy organizations—will oversee the goals of the project.

Specifically, the goals of the project include:

- A. Researching three go-to resources to share in the state;
- B. Providing two recommendations for programs and practices to implement to address disparities in cancer care;
- C. Identifying one major gap and goal for HSCO focused on equity in cancer care;
- D. Aggregating local and state resources for placement on the state society website;
- E. Conducting surveys and focus groups of providers, patient advocacy groups, and patients. of three different groups:
 - a. Providers across the state;
 - b. Patient advocacy organizations;
 - c. Patients from targeted communities; and
- F. Convening a Health Equity Summit that will unite project stakeholders with state and federal policymakers.

While there are many goals associated with the 3, 2, 1, Go! project, the Equity and Access Committee is not expected to do all of the work. The Committee will determine the best way to achieve these goals, with input and support from state society members, the Association of Community Cancer Centers, the Global Healthy Living Foundation, and project consultants.

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
