

University of Iowa **CALL FOR ABSTRACTS**

Submission Opens: Thursday, August 10, 2023 Submission Closes: Friday, September 29, 2023

OVERVIEW

The Iowa Oncology Society (IOS) invites you to participate in the IOS Outstanding Hematology-Oncology Recognition Competition for fellows by submitting an abstract.

The IOS recognition review committee will review all submitted abstracts. The committee will select up to 10 fellows' best abstracts for recognition through the IOS website. The first authors of the winning abstracts will be invited to submit a virtually research poster. The author of the highest rated abstract will be asked to provide a recorded narrative to their Power Point slide of their research. The first authors of each winning abstract will also receive a monetary award up to \$2,500.

Abstract categories may address the myriad of issues facing oncology and can be previously evaluated. Suggested topics are, but not limited to:

- Medical Oncology

- Surgical Oncology
- Developmental Therapeutics
 Clinical Trials/Interventions
 Retrospective Chart Review
- Survivorship

- Hematology
- Pediatric Oncology
- Palliative Care
- Radiation Oncology
- Neuro-Oncology
- Pilot Studies

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

There is a 250-word limit, excluding spaces, authors and institutions.

The title of your abstract should include significant words that reflect the content of the abstract but not refer to the study results or conclusions.

Do not use proprietary names alone in the title or body of the abstract. If necessary, you may include a proprietary name in parentheses directly after the generic name on first use in the body of the abstract.

Abstracts will be judged solely based on the data in the submitted abstract. Statements such as "further data will be available" are discouraged.

Place abbreviations in parentheses immediately after the first mention of a term or phrase; the abbreviation can then be used throughout the abstract. Take particular care to identify complex chemotherapy regimens accurately.

Your abstract should include a brief biography and/or CV, disclosure(s), your name, institution (affiliation), address, telephone number, fax number, and email address. As the First Author (presenter), you will receive all future correspondence from IOS.

Verify that all co-authors are aware of the contents of the abstract and support its data.

Abstracts must be submitted electronically via email as a WORD or PDF document. Each first author will receive an email verifying that IOS has received the abstract. Include the name and institution for each Co-Author associated with the abstract.
