MEMBERSHIP TYPES

Regular (\$100 annually): Physicians who are licensed, board-eligible, or board-certified in pediatrics, surgery, internal medicine, gynecology, hematology, or oncology.

Group (\$400 annually per group of four physicians): Four physicians in a hospital, academic, or group practice who meet Regular Membership requirements. *Additional physicians who meet the requirements may join at \$50 each.*

Associate Non-Affiliated (\$50 annually): Allied health professionals such as registered nurses, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, administrators, social workers, and office managers.

Associate Affiliated (complimentary): Affiliated with Group or Regular members.

Fellow (complimentary): Any physician participating in an approved oncology or hematology subspecialty training program.

Retired (complimentary): Retired oncologists who meet the requirements of Regular Membership.
