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# PENDING LEGISLATION

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#### FROM NELIS LEG.STATE. NV.US

SENATE BILL NO. 194–SENATORS OHRENSCHALL, FLORES, KRASNER; LANGE, PAZINA AND STONE

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to step therapy protocols. (BDR 57-885)


EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to insurance: requiring certain insurers to use evidence-based guidelines when developing a step therapy protocol: requiring such insurers to create a process by which an attending practitioner and an insured are authorized to apply for an exemption from a step therapy protocol: requiring such insurers to grant such an exemption in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law establishes a process by which a person may request an exemption from a step therapy protocol established by his or her insurer for a prescription drug used to treat late stage cancer or an associated symptom. If such a request is granted, existing law requires the insurer to cover the prescription drug. (NRS 689A.04041, 689B.0305, 689C.1684, 695A.259, 695B.19085, 695C.17333, 695G.1675) Sections 1, 3-8 and 11 of this bill require certain private-sector insurers to establish a process by which an insured and his or her attending practitioner may: (1) request an exemption from a step therapy protocol that applies to prescription drugs; and (2) appeal a decision concerning such a request. Sections 1, 3-8 and 11 require an insurer to: (1) grant such a request if the attending practitioner submits certain information providing adequate justification for the exemption; and (2) make the process to request an exemption and submit an appeal accessible on an Internet website maintained by the insurer. Sections 1, 3-8 and 11 additionally require certain private-sector insurers to use guidelines based on medical or scientific evidence, if available, when developing a step therapy protocol. 
