Oncology Medical Home Standards: Background and Standards

Patient Centered Medical Home Definition Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ)

Comprehensive Care	 Accountable for meeting patient's physical and mental health needs Requires team-based care
Patient Centered	 Relationship-based care with emphasis on the person and family
Coordinated Care	 Across all elements of the broader health system
Accessible Care	 Shorter time for urgent needs, 24/7 access, alternative methods of communication
Quality and Safety	 Performance measurement and improvement Evidence based care Measuring and responding to patient experience and satisfaction

Oncology Medical Home and Patient-Centered Cancer Care Certification

Applies care knowledge to support patient preferences, needs, and values

• Applies learnings and findings from previous initiatives to form a meaningful program that identifies and promotes quality cancer care for all that support that journey.

Establishes high quality cancer care

• A care delivery system that proves high quality, evidence-based cancer care with measurement.

Reinforces continual improvement

• Reinforces on-going quality cancer care with ongoing assessment and continual improvement.

Standardization

• Standard and consistent platform for quality cancer care for national, regional and local payers that are reformist in payment methodology.

Clinical and Financial

• Clinical and financial information for a transparent views of quality and value in cancer care.




Oncology Medical Home (OMH) Standards Development

The **ASCO-COA OMH standards** were developed based on:

- consensus of a multidisciplinary Expert Panel:
 - clinicians
 - health system administrators
 - patient advocates.
- a systematic review of evidence including
 - comparative peer-reviewed studies
 - studies of clinical pathways
 - systematic review of survivorship care plans

Standards approved by COA's Payment Reform Committee and the ASCO Board of Directors.

Patient Engagement

- Education about Oncology Medical Home
- Financial counseling
- Education on diagnosis and treatment
- Survivorship Care Program

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Availability & Access to Care

- *Expanded access to care; symptom triage
- *Emergency department, hospital admission
 & readmission data analysis; postdischarge follow-up
- Follow up for missed or cancelled appointments



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Oncology Medical Home Standards

Evidence Based Medicine

- *Oncology Clinical Pathway treatment planning and reports on physician compliance
- Clinical research trials access and participation

Equitable and Comprehensive Team-Based Care

- Medical oncologist directed care team; care coordination
- Team functioning, performance, and communication
- *Navigation Services/Psychosocial Assessment

- Patient experience survey and analysis
- *Quality improvement, analysis and sustainability
- *Electronic health record core data completeness and quality measures

Goals of Care, Palliative and End of Life Care Discussions

- *Goals of care discussions; end-of-life care; Access to Palliative Care

Chemotherapy Safety

 *Quality Oncology Practice Initiative (QOPI) Certification Program or Chemotherapy Safety Standards Compliance


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Success in Value-Based care

Innovations in alternative payment models need **complimentary innovations in care delivery** in order to achieve meaningful savings and improve quality





ASCO Patient-Centered Cancer Care Certification Pilot (APC4)

- Certification Standards adopted from Oncology Medical Home Standards and certification manual created
- July 2021 to June 2023 (recruitment, certification, evaluation)
- 12 practices and 2 commercial payers engaged
- Policy review, **on-site survey**, and compliance documentation
- Electronic Health Record and claims-based measures during and after certification process
 - ASCO Quality Reporting Registry (AQRR)
- Certification awards began July 2022
- Ongoing Assessment and Improvement Activities beginning August 2022

APC4 Pilot and Results

ASCO Patient-Centered Cancer Care Certification Pilot Results

Practice:

- All practice types/sizes demonstrated ability to achieve full compliance
- All practices initiated transformation to Patient-Centered care
- Single set of ASCO/COA standards supports gap analysis and provides a comprehensive roadmap to high quality cancer care for the entire patient journey
- Learning collaborative for practice/health system sharing successful experiences
- Prepares the cancer care teams for the reformation and recognition of care delivery based on quality and value
- Early evidence of positive impact on success in value-based contracting

ASCO Patient-Centered Cancer Care Certification Pilot Results

Patient:

- All APC4 practices administer a patient experience survey on a scheduled basis
- APC4 practices have overall positive patient satisfaction in all categories of patient experience survey
- All practices identified activities for continual improvement of patient satisfaction and experience
- All practices are recommended to develop a Patient and Family Advisory Council (PFAC) or some structure for direct patient and family perspective

ASCO Patient-Centered Cancer Care Certification Results

Insurer/Payer:

- There is interest in many payers participating in APC4 when scaled to full program
- Certification recognition helps a practice to move forward with payers to a value-based environment
- OMH standards have been utilized for payer value-based care programs
- Insurer/Payer and APC4 recognition

ASCO Patient-Centered Cancer Care Certification Pilot Results

Overall:

- Consistency and clarity for high quality, Patient-Centered, valuebased cancer care
- Independent mark of high quality based on ASCO and COA professional society recognition
- Ongoing assessment and improvement activities and monitoring
 - Sustainability
 - Expansion of quality initiatives and culture of continual quality improvement



Certification Process


ASCO Patient-Centered Cancer Care Certification (APC4)
