MEMBER TYPES

Group: Physicians in a practice or university who meet the requirements for Regular Membership qualify for Group Membership. **Dues: Up to five physicians \$750 (Small); 6-10 physicians \$1,000 (Medium); and 11+ physicians \$3,500 (Large). All affiliated allied health professionals are complimentary.**

Regular: Licensed physician caring for patients with cancer. **Dues: \$199.**

Allied Health Professional: Healthcare staff person including but not limited to registered nurse, nurse practitioner, clinical nurse specialist, pharmacist, physician assistant, administrator, social worker, and office manager. **Dues: Complimentary.**

Fellow: Physician enrolled in subspecialty training program to care for patients with cancer. **Dues: Complimentary.**

Retired: Former physician or allied health professionals who is no longer practicing. **Dues: Complimentary.**
